For the week of March 29, 2020

One of the best things you can do after hearing truths from the Word of God is to talk about them with others. Here are some questions to help get the conversation started. (hint: the first couple of questions are meant to “break the ice” and get people talking)

- If you could be any age again, what would it be? Why did you enjoy this season of life so much?
 - What was the most scared that you have ever been as a result of a weather related incident? (tornado, storm, flood, earthquake, etc.)
 - Read I Peter 1:13. Talk about the kinds of thoughts that you tend to wrestle with the most. The ones that you know are not “sober.”
 - Has the COVID-19 pandemic caused you to worry/doubt? How so?
 - What would it look like for you to “gird up the loins of your mind?”
 - How can your thoughts “lean toward hope?”
 - Read I Peter. 1:14. If COVID-19 has not been a “trigger” that tempts you to return to “former lusts,” what are the things that do “trigger” you?
 - Read I Peter 1:22. Why is it so hard to show “brotherly love” and “sacrificial love” during times of difficulty?
 - “One of the surest ways to ease your trial is to try to help someone else in the midst of theirs.” Do you agree with this statement?
 - Take some time to pray together.
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
