

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

For the week of October 25, 2020

One of the best things you can do after hearing truths from the Word of God is to talk about them with others. Here are some questions to help get the conversation started. (hint: the first couple of questions are meant to “break the ice” and get people talking)

- Would you rather have an unlimited gift certificate to a restaurant or a clothing store?
 - “Burdened” means “a heavy load causing distress.” What is the craziest thing that you (or someone you know) has done to “burden/load” a car, truck, shopping cart, etc?
 - How would you describe Paul’s hope?
 - Read Romans 9:1-3 and describe Paul’s burden.
 - How is the coexistence of hope and burdens a healthy thing?
 - Paul shared his conversion story and the people that he was most concerned about spiritually. Share your story and the person(s) that you are most burdened for at this time.
 - Talk about a time that you witnessed to someone that you were concerned about. What led up to it? How did it go? Any regrets?
 - Romans 10:13-17 were written in the context of Paul’s burden for the Jewish people he loved. Read these verses and talk about how they apply to the truths we talked about on Sunday.
 - Take some time to pray together.
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
