DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

For the week of November 14, 2021

One of the best things you can do after hearing truths from the Word of God is to talk about them with others. Here are some questions to help get the conversation started. (hint: the first couple of questions are meant to "break the ice" and get people talking)

- What are you looking forward to the most about Thanksgiving and Christmas?
- What's one of the biggest risks you've taken in your life or career that really paid off?
- Read Colossians 3:17 and I Corinthians 10:31. What is something that you find "easy" to do "in the name of the Lord," or "to the glory of God?"
- What is it that keeps us from doing "all" things "to the glory of God?"
- Read Colossians 3:23. Can you think of anything that do <u>now</u> "as to the Lord" that you used to do with a different motivation? What difference has it made?
- Colossians 3:18-19 talk about husbands and wives. Josh talked about the "crazy cycle," where husbands withhold love and wives withhold respect. Talk about how you have seen this cycle take place. How would "living for an Audience of One" change this cycle?
- Colossians 3:20-21 address children and fathers. Why are these commands needed? How would "living for an Audience of One" change these relationships?
- Colossians 3:22-4:1 talk about employers and employees. Talk about how "living for an Audience of One" produces a desire to work "heartily."
- Josh said, "Living for an Audience of One destroys apathy." Do you agree with this statement? Why? Which of these relationships in vs. 17-25 do you most struggle with being apathetic?
