## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

For the week of April 17, 2022

One of the best things you can do after hearing truths from the Word of God is to talk about them with others. Here are some questions to help get the conversation started. (hint: the first couple of questions are meant to "break the ice" and get people talking)

- We celebrated Easter on Sunday. What is your favorite Easter memory and/or tradition?
- "In•credible" means "so extraordinary as to seem impossible." Share an "incredible" story from your life (or one you've heard recently).
- Read Acts 26:8. This is the only place we see "incredible" used in the Scriptures. Out of all the 'incredible' stories in the Bible, do you think there's a reason that this word is only used in this passage?
- Read Acts 26:2. Why do you think Paul tells Agrippa that he is 'happy' to stand before him when he is really on trial for his life?
- Have you ever had a time where you knew that God was using something difficult in your life to do His will?
- When given the chance to witness, Paul simply tells his own story. How does telling your story help break down barriers for people to hear the gospel?
- Many of us do not have testimonies as dramatic as Paul's. However, there are things we can learn from Paul to help us in sharing our own experiences. What are they? What are some things that all testimonies have in common?
- Read Acts 26:24. Festus called Paul 'mad!' Has anyone thought that you were crazy for following Jesus?
- Talk about how what we believe about the resurrection has an impact on these two things: our eternal destination (26:28-29) and our existing direction (26:16)
- Take some time to pray together.
