

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

For the week of September 10, 2023

One of the best things you can do after hearing truths from the Word of God is to talk about them with others. Here are some questions to help get the conversation started. (hint: the first couple of questions are meant to “break the ice” and get people talking)

- What is one of your favorite memories with a grandparent?
 - What is one thing that you will definitely do, or not do, if you become a grandparent?
 - Talk about the kinds of goals that people have for their ‘senior’ years and compare them to Psalm 71:17-18.
 - Read Titus 2:1-8 and talk about how the ability to “teach” hinges on the phrase “that they may” in v. 4. Why is setting the example so important?
 - Read Psalm 71:1-5 and point out the things that the psalmist is asking God to do. Talk about what it looks like in our lives to do the same thing.
 - Josh described those verses as “giving up.” What are some areas that we are tempted to do “on our own,” instead of what we see in vs. 1-5?
 - Read Psalm 71:3-5 and point out the terms used to describe God. Josh described this as “looking up.” What are some practical ways that we can do this in our lives? (“continually resort” to him - v. 3)
 - Read Psalm 71:8, 14-18, and 24 and point out all the times that he “speaks up” about God. What are some practical ways that we can “speak up” in our lives?
 - What are the things that keep us from being actively involved in participating in the next generation’s spiritual development?
 - Take some time to pray together.
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
